With the Blessings of Satguru Swami Teonramji Maharaj every Saturday in the Satnam Sakhi Mandhir of Las Palmas a "Baal Satsang" takes place where children of all ages come to learn about our religion and Prem Prakash Panth.



Children from 3 to 10 years old come to the Satsang simply to listen, though sometimes there are moments in which they don't understand what's going on, due to the fact that we learn Geeta which is in sanskrit or other teachings of a high level for elders.

At the beginning of September 2008, a new course has begun for those children of small ages, who want to start learning the most basic things about our Panth.

What does this Satsang consist of?

It consists in giving lessons of a basic level in order for the children to get familiarized themselves with the basic concepts of the Panth. The Satsang starts by singing a "Dhuni" of "Hare ram ", "Sakhi Shivohum", "Satnam Sakhi" where the children repeat together with the teacher, they learn the names of the



different Gods in an interactive way. Also, they are told some short stories with morals in Sindhi, which is being translated in Spanish. The children should not only learn about the Panth, its very important to also lean the language of their native land. Our

Spiritual Master, Satguru Swami Bhagat Prakashji Maharaj, explain us in one his Satsang that although we are living in Spain we should never forget our language "Sindhi", and we should always try the new generation constantly practice their language, because we are Sindhi. In addition the children have some homework for example, to learn a "Prathna" and pray every morning, with this the children will remember God's name every day.

At the end of the Satsang, we play a DVD for the children of Bhagwans in a cartoon version, for example "Ganpati" or "Hanuman" Together with that, they are being served a small snack, which its considered as Parshad".

Now a day it's very important for the New Generation to learn "Sindhi" since a small age. When they grow old many elders regret for not learning since they were young, as the later you be trained the more difficult will be to learn and memorize things about our culture. Don't waste your free time and try to approach with your children to the Mandhir wherever you are. It's never late to learn! 😊
